Literacy

Spelling: Each week, spelling patterns will be taught and practised via a variety of activities. Spelling words will be provided for homework to aid revision.

Reading: There will be group guided reading sessions within class. Our class novel for Term 1, 'The Night Bus Hero', will help us explore the author's theme and message.

Writing: Our term 1 focus will be on descriptive writing, which will be linked to our IDL topics with many opportunities for creative, free writing.

Listening and Talking: We will develop these areas through our Skills Builder programme in addition to daily group discussions within the classroom.

Numeracy

Numeracy: This term, we will focus on place value alongside addition and subtraction.

Maths: We will be exploring measurement and shape through a variety of practical experiences.

We will be using Number Talks to help develop mental strategies.

Digital Learning

We will make regular use of digital technologies, in particular 'Microsoft Teams'. This will be used in class and for homework.

Interdisciplinary Learning

The first part of the term will focus on our class novel, 'The Night Bus Hero' by Onjali Q. Rauf. Alongside a core focus on Literacy, there will many links to Health and Wellbeing and Expressive Arts.

Later in the term, we will explore World War II as our IDL context for learning. As a class we will use our consultative planners to establish key questions the pupils wish to explore to ensure a child-led approach to our learning.
