

Interdisciplinary Learning (IDL)



- Across our school we use consultative planning methods which means that our "topic" based learning comes from our pupils.
 - The focus and content of this learning is determined by questions, investigations and interests from our children – they help to design what they would like to learn.
- The teacher then crafts and builds activities to support and develop this learning, alongside curriculum experiences, outcomes and planned assessments using our national Curriculum For Excellence benchmarks.
- This term, our learning context will begin with "The Night Bus Horo" and then World War II

Literacy – Reading



 We will be focussing on key reading skills and developing our independence to introduce these skills in literature circles.

 Each child will have a group reading book and homework will be set each week. This may be specific pages, or tasks.

Literacy – Writing



- We are using the PM writing scheme to focus on key writing skills which will link with other curricular areas.
- Our first context for learning is 'description'.



Literacy – Listening & Speaking



 We will focus on listening and talking throughout the term. We will incorporate this during our IDL and reading lessons.



Literacy – Listening and Talking

Literacy – Spelling



- We will continue to follow the 'Jolly Grammar' spelling programme.
- Children will focus on a new spelling rule each week and there will be tasks to develop these skills alongside homework.



Numeracy and Maths



- Numeracy The focus this term will be Fractions, Decimals and Percentages & Multiples, Factors and Primes.
- Maths The focus for this term will be Data Analysis and Probability.
- We will also continue to develop mental strategies using 'Number Talks' and explore problem solving through real life contexts.
- We continue to use a range of resources and programmes

to support our numeracy and soths.

BYOD (Bring Your Own Device)

Saff and pupil use of digital tools in Mid Calder Primary School has been recognised and celebrated across West schönik Canucial and beyond, and we wich to continue using this powerful tool to motivate and engage our learners. In our school, we have an Anrywhere, Anytime Learning (AAL) wrieters network. This allows personal mobile devices to connect to the internet using a password protected, audited connection. As we hold the Digital School Award status, we offer the opportunity to bright andheld devices that the children use at home into School. This is called Bring Your Own Device (BYOD). In doing this, we aim to enhance children's learning experiences and prepare them with Mills for learning light and work.

To ensure we have a shared understanding of what being a BYOD school entails, the children have created a 'BYOD Responsible Use Contract.'. A <u>number of</u> key points to highlight from this are:

1. When the devices are not being used, they will be kept in a class box to keep them safe.

2. Pupils are responsible for the safety of their own devices in school.

 Pupils will only use their devices when they are <u>asked, and</u> are expected to use them responsibly to support their learning. Any misuse of trust will result in a loss of device time for individuals.

4. Devices will not be permitted to be used out with school learning hours. This includes

breakfast club, soft start, break times or lunch times. 5. Using the permission slip attached, parents/carers must give permission for pupils to bring in and use their own device.

We understand that families have different experiences and views about the use of devices at home. In school, our children have access to a variety of digital tools which will always be available for their use. We would like to stress that there is no expectation to take part in BrOO, and that the AAL network is available to give greater choice to parents and learners. Please do not feel that this is a necessity.
