

## Interdisciplinary Learning (IDL)

- Across our school we use consultative planning methods which means that our "topic" based learning comes from our pupils.
- The focus and content of this learning is determined by questions, investigations and interests from our children

   they help to design what they would like to learn.
- We then create activities to support and develop this learning, alongside our national Curriculum For Excellence benchmarks.
- This term, our learning context will begin with a novel study — 'There's a boy in the Girl's Bathroom' by Louis Sachar.



















# <u>Literacy - Reading</u>

Reading sessions will focus on 4 main reading skills:

- Predicting
- Summarising
- Questioning
- Clarifying

We use a variety of texts to
engage the children, including
their group reading books.



# Reading Homework

- Reading books will be sent home on a <u>Tuesday</u> and reading homework should be completed by the following <u>Monday</u>.
- Please use your child's reading record to let us know how reading is going at home. Be honest!
- Try to encourage your child to complete this if possible, as the following week's discussions and task could be about what they have previously read.
- Please ensure your child brings their reading book and reading record to school every day, as they may require the book to complete tasks in class.

## <u>Literacy - Writing</u>

- There's a Boy in the Girls' Bathroom:
  - Research to complete a fact file about the author,
     Louis Sachar.
  - Character profiles and descriptions.
  - Diary entries.
- PM Writing:
  - Using our school writing resources, PM writing, we will focus on writing information reports.
  - We will look at the purpose and structure of this type of writing.

## <u>Literacy - Spelling</u>

- We will continue to follow 'Phonics International' spelling and phonics programme.
- Children will learn a new spelling sound every week, with activities in class, alongside homework.
- This should be transferred in their writing tasks.

# <u>Literacy - Listening and Talking</u>

- P5/6 will be offered daily opportunities to become **confident individuals**, expressing their opinions and sharing learning and experiences.
- Children will be encouraged to build confidence when talking to others, focussing on, pace, tone, gesture, eye contact, volume, expression and emphasis.
- Children should also show respect for the views of others by responding appropriately in discussions.

## Numeracy and Maths

- Numeracy The focus this term will be place value and the four operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division)
- Maths The focus for this term will be Data Handling
- We will also continue to develop mental strategies using 'Number Talks' and explore problem solving through real life contexts.
- We continue to use a range of resources and programmes to support our numeracy and maths.





The programme allows us to support every child build essential skills that will not only help them thrive in school but also in their wider lives.




















### Homework




