



P2 Learning Letter – August 2026

We would like to welcome our P2 children back to a new year at Mid Calder Primary School. We hope you have had a lovely summer. We have spent the last 2 weeks getting to know your children and establishing new routines. We have been working on our class community, particularly focusing on our class charter, school rules and values. The children have also been looking at the UN Rights of a child and have been making decisions about how the rights fit into our classroom. The children have been discussing how we ensure our classroom is a safe and caring learning environment and thinking of ways that they can take ownership of this ethos.

English & Literacy

Phonics: We are revising sounds we have previously learned in Primary 1 and developing decoding/ encoding and blending skills. We will be using Phonics International this year to support us.

Reading: We are focusing on reading tricky words and blending sounds together to read short words. Reading sessions will focus on characters, settings and making predictions about the story, allowing children to build on their comprehension skills.

Writing: Handwriting will focus on lower case letter formation. Our writing focus will be descriptions, identifying describing words and ways to make our writing more interesting.

Listening and Talking: We have been getting to know each other through circle time games and news time. The 'All About Me' box will be introduced and a different child will take it home each week.

Maths & Numeracy

Children will participate in daily number talks. This is a short session with the aim of developing number sense – awareness of numbers and what they are, how numbers can be made, subitizing and addition and subtraction skills.

Numeracy:

- Revision of the numbers to 30 – counting forwards and backwards, recognising numbers, using different counting strategies
- Revision of the formation of numbers to 30 and beyond
- Progress to working with number sequences to 30 and beyond
- Skip counting in 2's, 5's 10's
- Use of concrete materials

Maths

- Data handling – linked to our Toys and Games IDL – sorting/comparing/using tally marks to represent quantity

Interdisciplinary Learning: Toy Land

This term our context for learning is 'Toy Land'. We will be learning about this context through the curriculum areas of Social Studies, Maths and Technologies. The key questions we will explore are:

- What are toys and how do we use them?
- What are the most popular toys?
- What were toys like in the past?
- What is the difference between toys today and the past?
- How are toys made?

Please ensure your child wears clothing suitable for taking part in P.E.
